Structural Design Analysis and Preparation of a Feasibility Study: Three Options for the Existing Powhatan Street and Westbrook Drive Bridge.

Motion: Approval of the proposal by Charles P. Johnson & Associates, Inc., dated July 31, 2023. The proposal is for a feasibility study on the Powhatan Street and Westbrook Drive Bridge and it should not exceed the amount of \$41,928.11. The motion passed 5-0-0.

National Hispanic Heritage Month Proclamation.

Motion: to approve the proclamation honoring Hispanic Heritage Month September 15 through October 15, 2023. The motion passed 5-0-0.

National Preparedness Month Proclamation.

Motion: To proclaim September 2023, as National Preparedness Month in the City of New Carrollton. The motion passed 5-0-0.

Purchase of Two Electric Vehicles for Parking Enforcement.

Motion: To purchase two Parking Enforcement vehicles through a budget amendment. The motion passed 5-0-0.

During the City Council Workshop/Legislative Meeting of September 20, 2023, the City Council read a Charter Amendment Resolution 24-01: Proposing to amend the City Charter § C-6 “Qualifications and Registration of Voters” to add “Supplemental Voter Registry” to modify the provisions of the qualifications to become a registered voter of the City eligible to vote in municipal elections, providing the creation of a separate supplemental voter registry in addition to those voters of the City registered with the Prince George’s County Board of Elections.

CHIMNEY FIRES



More than one-third of Americans use fireplaces, wood stoves and other fuel-fired appliances as primary heat sources in their homes. Unfortunately, many people are unaware of the fire risks when heating with wood and solid fuels.

Heating fires account for 36% of residential home fires in rural areas every year. Often these fires are due to creosote buildup in chimneys and stovepipes. All home heating systems require regular maintenance to function safely and efficiently.

Simple steps prior to the heating season will help reduce the possibility of a chimney fire in your home.

Maintenance - Good maintenance is a very important step in preventing chimney fires!

- Have your chimney checked every year by a qualified chimney professional.
- Burn only well-seasoned hardwoods.
- Install a chimney cap.
- Install a carbon monoxide detector.
- Have your chimney sweep ensure that your chimney has an appropriate liner.
- Following a violent storm, earthquake, flood or lightning strike, have your chimney inspected for damage - inside and out.

Prevention - Remember prevention is your best defense against fire.

- If you have a wood or coal stove, be sure it is installed at least 36 inches away from the wall. Keep combustible materials well away from the stove and chimney connector. Place an approved stove board under the unit to protect the floor from heat and hot coals which might drop out.

***Be Prepared – Know what to do in case of fire.
If you suspect a chimney fire,
evacuate your home and call 9-1-1***

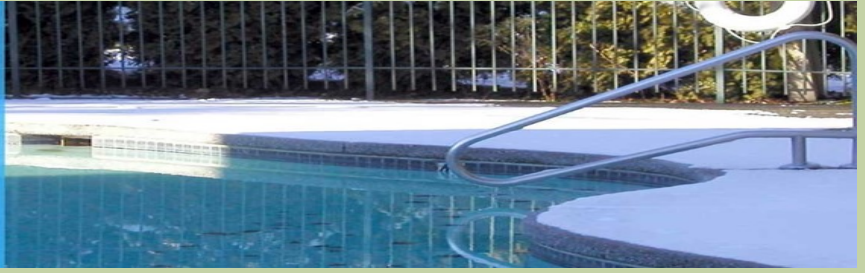

WINTER POOL MAINTENANCE: THE RIGHT WAY



Swimming pools are great recreation for summer months, but should be adequately prepped for winter!

Are you a pool owner preparing to close your pool down for the season? Here are a few helpful tips that will help you keep your property in compliance through the process.

Draining waste water from pools directly onto public ways such as streets or across sidewalks is not permitted. Waste water from pools should be directed completely onto the pool owners' property and directed in a way as to not cause adverse runoff effects to adjacent properties.

Storable swimming pools and wading pools must be stored away between November 1 and April 1 of each year. Compliant storage of swimming pools is considered in a garage, shed, or similarly enclosed storage structure.

For in-ground pools, specific winterization steps should be taken to maintain the integrity of the pool over winter months and ease preparation for use again in the spring. Pools should be thoroughly cleaned of all debris such as leaves, insects, dirt, etc. The tiles or lining should also be adequately scrubbed or brushed. To protect the structure of the pool itself a minimum level of water should be kept in the pool to counter the expansion of the surrounding ground due to freezing. Ensure pumps, filters, pipes, and other equipment is adequately drained to protect from freeze damage. Other steps include properly balancing water chemistry and covering your pool with a secure cover to prevent any accidental drownings. For more information contact your local pool specialist.

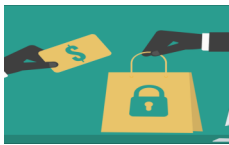
HOLIDAY SAFETY AND CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

At Home

- Make sure all doors and windows have secondary locks (window pins, deadbolts, dowels, etc.) and use them!
 - Don't hide spare keys in mailboxes or planters, or under doormats.
 - Ensure that dark areas and entrances have outdoor lights that are turned on after dark or are activated by sensors.
 - Keep trees and shrubbery trimmed so they do not conceal doors and windows. Remember, overgrown foliage can provide a hiding place for criminal
- Lock your vehicle and remove all the valuables. Yes, even in your driveway.

Strangers at your Door

- Use caution anytime there is a stranger at your door.
- Be suspicious of unexpected sales calls or deliveries. Ask for identification.
- Be aware of scams that criminals commit to take advantage of people's generosity during the holidays. Investigate charities before making donations. Ask how the funds will be used.

Veterans Day Observed: Friday, November 10, 2023 – No Trash Collection , No Bulk Trash Collection & No Leaf Collection .

Thanksgiving Holiday Week: Wednesday, November 22, 2023, No Bulk Trash Collection.

Thanksgiving Holiday: Thursday, November 23, 2023, No Trash Collection.

Day after Thanksgiving Holiday: Friday, November 24, 2023, No Trash Collection.

Christmas Day Holiday: Monday, December 25, 2023, No Trash Collection & No Bulk Trash Collection.

There will be two City wide curb leaf vacuum collections. The first curb leaf vacuum collection will start on **Monday, November 6, 2023**, and will be divided into four sections. The second curb leaf vacuum collection will resume upon completion of the first collection.

Both raked and paper bagged leaves will be collected and recycled. Residents are asked to place their leaves in the Tree Box, and not on the street the weekend before their scheduled collection.

Remember occasional delays may be caused by weather, equipment failure, and leaf drop rate.
