In late July, I was invited to the kick off re-election campaign event for the incumbent College Park Mayor Patrick Wojahn. College Park will be holding local elections in November 2019 and Patrick wanted some of us local mayors to come out and offer support. The mayors from University Park, Greenbelt, and I attended. I was struck with the similarities in College Park's priorities and our own here in New Carrollton. Mayor Wojahn described a number of College Park community successes and efforts he plans to take to introduce new community groups. I like to learn from other towns' success stories.

College Park has some offerings that may be a challenge for us - they host two Farmers weekly Markets, promote community biking through a local bike shop, encourage residents to gather on Saturday mornings to exercise together at the Parkrun 5K, and support healthy eating and living through the local organic food market. All of these are excellent ways to attract locals to get involved with each other. I applaud Patrick for his vision and I remain on the lookout for openings to establish our own community groups here at home to promote connectedness and healthy activities. Our Green Team, Community Gardens, the Friends of the Police, the Library Friends, the Seniors Lunch Program, and our Youth Sports programs are all good starts. College Park's plans to construct a new City Hall Building is another goal that we share with them. I have hopes that we are successful in working with the MNCPPC to obtain land to move the New Carrollton City Hall closer to the heart of town where the schools, recreational facilities and library are located. I'll do my best to keep you updated of community activities and events.

## **Code Enforcement Hard at Work**

As many of you have seen, your Code Enforcement Department has been hard at work over the last year conducting inspections, patrolling the City and responding to resident concerns and complaints. In additional to handling their daily work assignments, your Code team led by Isiah Harris, Inspectors Pamla Bennett, Dennis Washington and Barry Wade, have collective closed over 1,600 open cases since the beginning of this year and have reduced our open cases count down to 230. Through this period Code Enforcement Department also conducted 143 rental inspections, reviewed 53 building permits and resolved 53 citizen complaints. A monumental accomplishment.



- Industrial accident
- Drug overdose or poisoning
- Neck or back injury

As leaf season is just around the corner. Start to prepare by taking a quick walk around the exterior of your home, looking for clogged and damaged gutters, exterior drains that may be clogged, overgrowth and any other exterior damage. Cleaning out gutters and drains is a miserable, messy and a stinky job, but the earlier you start identifying these potential problems the more cost effective it is. Early maintenance can help reduce costly repairs later. Installing gutter guards could put that headache behind you, but how the heck are you supposed to know which type to buy? Examine the three most popular types of gutter guards: screen, surface tension and fine mesh. Compare the different features, installation methods and prices to help you decide which ones will work best for your house. And if you install them yourself, you can save tons of money-some pro installers charge as much as \$20 per ft.! The guards we'll cover are designed for 5-in. K-style gutters, typical on many homes.




