# **New City Administrative Officer!**

The City of New Carrollton welcomed Ms. Latasha C. Gatling who joined the City of New Carrollton staff as the City Administrative Officer on Monday, May 3, 2021. In her new role, she will oversee the Administration, Finance, and Economic Development functions of the City government.

Ms. Gatling has a vast amount of experience in education and government. She has served in many roles during her career including an elected official and a City Manager. She has been the Interim City Manager for the City of Mount Rainier since 2019 and has been successful in overseeing capital improvement projects, economic development, and secured over \$500,000.00 in grant funding. Before working for the City of Mount Rainier, Ms. Gatling worked as a Public Relations Liaison for former County Councilmember Karen Toles and as a City Manager for the City of Seat Pleasant. Prior to becoming the City Manager for Seat Pleasant, she was elected to the City Council and served as the Council President. As an educator, she was a Professor for the American Public University System and taught courses in African-American History and the History of Africa. She also was a Historian for IIF Data Solutions. Ms. Gatling continues to serve as an Adjunct Instructor for the College of Southern Maryland.

# **BULK PICKUP REMINDER:**

Prince George's County & the City of New Carrollton enforces the mattress/box spring plastic cover ordinance. Residents requesting curbside collection of bulky items will be required to completely cover mattresses and box springs in a no-vent protective plastic covering. Plastic no-vent mattress covers are available at many local retail stores and available for purchase at the Public Works Department for a nominal fee. Bulk Pick Ups can be scheduled by calling **301-577-1008** or by visiting us at www.newcarrolltonmd.gov under "SERVICES".

**YARD WASTE:** All bagged yard waste will be picked up on Mondays and Tuesdays. Bagged yard waste includes grass, leaves, small shrubs, brush, branches and limbs (less than 5 feet in length and 4 inches in diameter; can be tied up in bundles).

<u>Recycle</u>: All recyclable items are to be placed in the same container. Recyclables are collected without the need to sort or separate. Equipment at the Materials Recycling Facility sorts the materials.

Acceptable Items Glass: food and beverage containers.

<u>Acceptable Items Metals</u>: empty aerosol cans, aluminum, bimetal, ferrous, and steel food and beverage containers, aluminum foil and coat hangers.

<u>Acceptable Items Mixed Paper/Corrugated Cardboard</u>: all paper, aseptic/gable-top milk and juice cartons, catalogs, flattened corrugated cardboard (boxes), frozen food packaging, hard and soft covered books, craft paper bags and wrapping paper, magazines, newspapers with inserts and paper board (cereal and cracker boxes) and telephone books.

<u>Acceptable Items Plastics</u>: drinking cups/glasses, flower pots, narrow-neck containers with code identification numbers 1 through 5 and number 7 wide-mouth containers such as peanut butter, yogurt, cottage cheese, sour cream, mayonnaise and whipped topping; margarine/butter tubs; prescription bottles and coat hangers.

Remember to rinse all food and beverage containers and to recap or place the lids in the recycling cart/bin.

# **Non-Acceptable Recycling Items:**

<u>Unacceptable Items</u>: auto parts, broken glass dishes, electronics, hazardous materials, light bulbs, medical waste, mirrors, motor oil containers, packing foam and peanuts, plastic bags, plastic utensils and windowpanes.

# STREET LIGHTS IN NEW CARROLLTON







# CAN'T PAY RENT BECAUSE OF COVID-19?



# Who can apply?

- Tenants unable to pay their rent due to a loss of income because of COVID-19.
- Landlords with occupied rental units on behalf of their tenants.



# What is required of the tenants?

- Income information to verify that the household's income does not exceed 80% of the area median income, as determined by HUD, and adjusted for household size.
- Written description of the direct or indirect hardship experienced due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Tenants will NOT need to provide Social Security Number, birth certificate or immigration status information in order to apply.



### What can ERAP cover?

- Delinquent rental and utility payments beginning on or after April 1, 2020.
- Rent assistance will be paid directly to the landlord/management company on behalf of the tenant through ACH direct deposit. Utility payments will be paid directly to the utility companies.

# The Prince George's County's 2021 Emergency Rental and Utilities Assistance Program (ERAP) helps eligible households who have been financially impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. The program provides payment assistance for renters who need help with rent and utilities.

Applications will be accepted until funds are no longer available.
