

Lock Your Car and Block a Thief

It may take you only a minute to run into a convenience store for a cup of coffee or a morning paper. But if you leave your keys in the car with the motor running, it takes a thief only seconds to drive off with your car.

A surprising number of people, however, do just that: they leave the keys in the ignition, and let the motor run, while they run into the store. That practice wastes gas, doesn't help the environment, and could result in a stolen car. A 1996 survey by the Regional Auto Theft Team showed that 25 percent of stolen cars were taken when the driver left the keys in the ignition.

Leaving your keys behind like that is an open invitation to criminals, so don't give them that opportunity. When you park your car, take the keys - and let the thief take a hike.

21-1101 - Unattended motor vehicle

- (a) Duty of driver upon leaving unattended vehicle. -- Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, a person driving or otherwise in charge of a motor vehicle may not leave it unattended until the engine is stopped, the ignition locked, the key removed, and the brake effectively set.
- (i) Is in charge of a motor vehicle that has had the engine started using a remote keyless ignition system and has been operating unattended for up to 5 consecutive minutes when the vehicle is not in motion; or
- (ii) Allows a motor vehicle that is locked and is on private property not open to the public to operate unattended for up to 5 consecutive minutes when the vehicle is not in motion.



Dog Waste! Scoop it, Bag it and Trash it!

Picking up after your dog goes further than making your neighbors happy. When you are out walking your dog, it is your duty to collect their waste. The trails and parks we enjoy with our Dogs are adjacent to creeks and reservoirs. Dog waste that is not collected is carried away during rainstorms to nearby waterways, and can be a significant source of pollution. Dog waste carries harmful bacteria like E. coli, which poses serious health risks if allowed to come in contact with water.

Leash Law: It is against the law for the owner or custodian of any animal to allow the animal to run at-large. Any dog or cat that is found at-large may be impounded. A Violation Notice may be issued by a City Police Officer or Animal Control Officer to the owner of an animal found at-large.



Stray Dogs and Cats: Anyone who picks up a stray animal must immediately notify and turn the animal over to the Prince George's County Animal Control Facility.

The Clean Water Partnership has completed the in-stream portion of the Briers Mill Run restoration along Carrollton Parkway. Erosion was corrected, the banks stabilized and the clogged culvert under Lamont Drive was cleaned out. Additionally, they were able to add a new drain between the two Community Gardens.

We will plant 124 trees along the stream over the next several weeks. Guardrails will be install next on portions of the creek if necessary for safety. Aside from the new trees, wildflower seeds were sow on the banks of the stream, and lawn seed along the tops. Willow stakes were installed along the water edge, which are live and intended to root and grow into streamside shrubs. The lawn portion along the street will be moved by the City, while the wildflowers on the slopes will offer flowers throughout the spring, summer and fall and offer a riparian buffer. The pedestrian bridge at Quentin Street will most likely be installed this summer as it is still awaiting final permitting details. The project was funded by a public/private partnership between Prince George's County and Corvias Solutions to deliver functional and sustainable stormwater infrastructure. One big bonus of getting in this program is that CWP will also perform functional maintenance of the restoration for 30 years. However, the City will be responsible for mowing and litter patrol.
