

POLICE PREVENTION SAFETY TIPS! THE NEW CARROLLTON POLICE DEPARTMENT ENCOURAGES PEOPLE TO TAKE THE FOLLOWING STEPS TO SECURE THEIR HOMES AND BELONGINGS.

DRIVERS: Park only in well-lighted areas at night. Check for strangers who might be "casing" the area before you exit or enter your car.

AT HOME: Check for signs of forced entry such as broken glass, a torn screen, or pry marks before venturing inside.

AT WORK: Meet clients at the office during business hours. Develop a code word with people checking on you to let them know when you are in trouble. Offer seems "to Good to be True." AT A HOTEL OR MOTEL: Before trip—pack flashlight, make a copy of important documents (credit cards, driver's license, etc.), photograph valuables that you are taking with you (i.e. jewelry). PEDESTRIANS: Plan ahead so that when you walk you are very visible to other people. Be alert and aware of your surroundings. Know your destination and route., DO NOT allow a stranger to follow you to your doorstep. Go to a public place where you can call the police whenever you feel threatened. CODE ENFORCEMENT

Motor Vehicle Repairs

Regular preventive maintenance is probably the single most important thing you can do as a car owner. Maintaining your vehicle now will save you costly repairs in the future. However, not everyone agrees on what vehicle maintenance is, what you can do, and when you should do it. Let's clear that up, and take a look at the City Code of Ordinances.

The Department of Code Enforcement receives numerous complaints of vehicle repairs and maintenance being preformed within the City of New Carrollton. Often it is accompanied by the question: Is this type of work permitted in New Carrollton? Well, there are several factors that must be considered, but more often than not the answer is yes, it is permitted.

While some may elect to take their vehicle to an automotive shop, some more experienced residents may wish to do the required services on their own. The basics, like changing your oil, coolant, filters, tires, headlamps, bulbs, belts and batteries are all tasks that are considered incidental maintenance. These repairs, and others that require similar time and expense are also permitted on private property in the City of New Carrollton.

Repair and Maintenance

Repairs and maintenance of vehicles may be performed in driveways and carports provided they meet the following criteria:

- The vehicle must be registered to the owner/legal occupant of the property and registered at that address.
- The repairs are performed by the owner/ legal occupant of the property.
- The repairs do not include removal or replacement of any engine, transmission, differential or structural body part.
- All repairs/maintenance shall only occur between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. and must be completed within forty-eight (48) hours.
- All tools, supplies, parts and miscellaneous equipment must be removed from the public view no later than 7:00 p.m. This includes all jacks and car ramps.
- All excess or used oil, coolant or other non-biodegradable fluids must be disposed of at a lawful disposal site. The Department of Public Works has an available disposal container onsite.

Prohibited Acts

It is unlawful to perform any repairs or maintenance (with the exception of emergency maintenance to move a vehicle off the street) on any motor vehicle that is on a city street, property, or within a city right-of-way.



Winter Storms

Snowfall totals vary greatly in Maryland. Garrett County, in far western Maryland, often receives as much snow as areas of the central plains and interior areas of New York and New England. Areas of the lower Eastern Shore often have little or no snow during a winter season. In the populous central part of the state, snow totals can vary greatly from one season to the next. Many winter storms are accompanied by low temperatures and sometimes, strong winds, ice, sleet, and freezing rain. Severe winter weather has the potential to knock out heat, power, and communication services to your home or office, sometimes for days.

Before

Make sure your home is well insulated and that you have weather stripping around your doors and window sills to keep the warm air inside.

Fully winterize your vehicle and keep your gas tank at least half full to avoid ice in the tank and fuel lines.

Include adequate clothing and blankets in your ready kit to keep you warm.

During

Avoid overexertion when shoveling snow. Overexertion can bring on a heart attack—a major cause of death in the winter. If you must shovel snow, stretch before going outside.

Keep dry. Change wet clothing frequently to prevent a loss of body heat. Wet clothing loses all of its insulating value and transmits heat rapidly.

Watch for signs of frostbite. These include loss of feeling and white or pale appearance in extremities such as fingers, toes, ear lobes, and the tip of the nose. If symptoms are detected, get medical help immediately.

Watch for signs of hypothermia. These include uncontrollable shivering, memory loss, disorientation, incoherence, slurred speech, drowsiness, and apparent exhaustion. If symptoms of hypothermia are detected, get the victim to a warm location, remove wet clothing, warm the center of the body first and give warm, non-alcoholic beverages if the victim is conscious. Get medical help as soon as possible.

Let someone know your destination, your route, and when you expect to arrive. If your car gets stuck along the way, help can be sent along your predetermined route.

If the pipes freeze, remove any insulation or layers of newspapers and wrap pipes in rags. Completely open all faucets and pour hot water over the pipes, starting where they were most exposed to the cold (or where the cold was most likely to penetrate).

MARYLAND'S CELL PHONE USE BAN (TR 21-1124.2)



Effective October 1, 2013, Maryland's cell phone law now prohibits drivers from using a handheld cell phone while a motor vehicle is in motion.

This is a primary offense. Law enforcement officers can stop a driver solely for using a handheld cell phone.

No other offense is needed.

- Drivers will receive a fine (including court cost) of:
- \$83 first offense
- \$140 second offense
- \$160 third & subsequent offenses

MARYLAND'S SEAT BELT LAW (TR 22-412.3)



Effective October 1, 2013, Maryland has a primary seat belt law for front seat occupants AND a secondary seat belt law for back seat occupants.

- Tickets can be issued to drivers and front seat passengers even if no other violation is observed.
- Each person that is not buckled up (driver and passenger) may receive a ticket (including court costs) of \$83 for not wearing a seat belt.
- In the case where any passenger under the age of 16 is not buckled up, the driver may receive a ticket for each offense. For instance, if a driver is stopped and not wearing a seat belt and a passenger under the age of 16 is also not restrained, the driver may receive an adult seat belt ticket (including court costs) of \$83 for himself and a ticket (including court costs) of \$83 for the passenger.
