

Candle Awareness

Candles are used in many homes and may look pretty, but they are a cause of many home fires which can lead to death. Please remember that a candle is an open flame which means that it can easily catch anything on fire. There is a safer alternative to open flame candles, flameless candles! They look and smell like real candles.

If a power outage occurs? Use flashlights and battery-powered lanterns, DO-NOT use candles as a source of lighting in the event of a power outage.

The best crime prevention is to provide our community with the proper education awareness.

BE THE EYES OF YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD!

The most important thing you can do to support your community is call the police to report a crime or suspicious activity.

CRIME PREVENTION TIPS & PRECAUTIONS TO TAKE!

- Make your home look occupied, and make it difficult to break in.
- Lock all outside doors and windows before you leave the house or go to bed. Even if it is for a short time, lock your doors.
- Leave lights on when you go out. If you are going to be away for any length of time, connect some lamps to automatic timers to turn them on in the evening and off during the day.
- Keep your garage door closed and locked.
- Don't allow daily deliveries of mail, Newspapers or flyers to build up while you are away. Arrange with the Post Office to hold your mail, or arrange for a friend or neighbor to take them regularly.
- Arrange for your lawn to be mowed if you are going away for an extended period of time.
- Check the locks on your doors and windows and replace them with secure devices as necessary.
- Pushbutton locks on doorknobs are easy for burglars to open. Install deadbolt locks on all your outside doors.
- Sliding glass doors are vulnerable, special locks are available for better security.
- Never leave keys under doormats, flowerpots, mailboxes, or other "secret" hiding places, burglars know where to look for hidden keys.
- Keep a detail inventory of your valuable possessions, including a description of the items, date of purchase and original value, and serial numbers, Make sure to keep a copy in a safe place.
- Make a photographic or video record of valuable objects, heirlooms, and antiques.

Your insurance company can provide assistance in making and keeping your inventory.

- Have an engraver mark your valuables with your driver's license number.

Marked items are harder for a burglar to dispose of, and easier for Police to recover.

DON'T TEMPT A THIEF

- Lawn mowers, barbecues, and bicycles are best stored out of sight.
- Always lock your garden sheds and garages.
- Use curtains on garage and basement windows.
- Never leave notes on your door such as "gone shopping".
- Have adequate exterior lighting. A motion-sensitive light is recommended for back and side yards.
- Trim trees and shrubs so they cannot be used as hiding places for intruders.

IF YOUR HOME IS BROKEN INTO:

- DO NOT ENTER— The perpetrator may still be inside.
- Use a neighbor's phone to call the Police.
- Do not touch anything or clean up until the Police have inspected for evidence.
- Write down the license plate numbers on any suspicious vehicles.

VEHICLE SECURITY

***DARKNESS IS
FALLING
EARLIER***



Soon all those activities previously done in daylight will begin to occur in darkness: Going to your vehicle after work, picking up your children from after-school activities and sports. Sooner than you realize you will be doing holiday shopping in the evening. Here are a few crime prevention tips to make the transition easier.

Everyday law enforcement agencies take crime reports from victims of burglaries and thefts of property from their vehicles as well as stolen vehicle reports. Though nothing can prevent you from ever being a victim of such a crime, there are things you can do to lessen the odds of your being victimized.

Many vehicle burglars are opportunists and will look for the vehicle that is unlocked or the one that may be locked but has valuables left inside. Even if your vehicle is locked and alarmed, if there are valuables inside (even covered up) a window may be smashed to gain entry. This all can occur in a matter of seconds.

Don't make it easy for them:

- ◆ Never leave the keys inside the vehicle.
- ◆ Make sure that all windows are up all the way before locking your vehicle.
- ◆ Lock your vehicle even if you are only going to be away from it a short time.
- ◆ Lock your vehicle even if it is parked in your driveway, inside your garage or on the street in front of your residence.
- ◆ Make sure your vehicle alarm is activated whenever you exit/lock your vehicle.
- ◆ Do not leave valuables, (i.e. purses, wallets, cellular phones, cameras, laptop computers etc.) inside your vehicle, even if it is locked.
- ◆ Even if your vehicle is locked and alarmed, do not attempt to "hide" valuables under the seat or under an item of clothing in the vehicle.
- ◆ If you have a removable faceplate on your stereo, always remove and take it with you. Do not leave it in the glove compartment.
- ◆ Please report any theft from your vehicle immediately to your local law enforcement agency. It is up to you whether or not you chose to report this to your insurance company.
- ◆ If you observe anyone acting suspiciously in the area of your vehicle, report it immediately to law enforcement by dialing 9-1-1 on your cellular phone.
- ◆ Do not keep a "Hide-a-Key" in the wheel well. Burglars will usually look for a key and if they find one they will use it to enter your vehicle or even steal it!

PARKING LOT SAFETY TIPS

NOTHING YOU CAN DO WILL PROTECT YOU FROM BEING THE VICTIM OF A CRIME, 100% OF THE TIME. HOWEVER BY PRACTICING GOOD CRIME PREVENTION YOU CAN LESSEN YOUR ODDS OF BEING A VICTIM.

- ✦ During the fall/winter when it gets darker earlier, park under a parking lot light when you arrive to work or are returning from lunch. That way the area around your car will be well lit when you are walking to the parking lot after work when it is dark. This also pertains if you are shopping at night.
- ✦ Make sure all your windows are up and all doors locked when you leave your vehicle.
- ✦ Utilize your car alarm system if you have one.
- ✦ Stay alert and be aware of your surroundings when walking to your car.
- ✦ Have your keys already in hand when you approach your car. Searching for car keys can make you vulnerable.
- ✦ Do not leave cell phones, wallets, purses, briefcases, packages, shopping bags etc. on the seat or anywhere in the car.

Smoke Detectors Save Lives: The majority of fatal home fires happen at night, when people are asleep. Contrary to popular belief, the smell of smoke may not wake a sleeping person. The poisonous gases and smoke produced by a fire can numb the senses and put you into a deeper sleep.

Inexpensive household smoke detectors sound an alarm, alerting you to a fire. By giving you time to escape, smoke detectors cut your risk of dying in a home fire nearly in half.

Is One Smoke Detector Enough?: Every home should have a smoke detector outside of every sleeping area and on every level of the home, including the basement.

Fire and building codes also require a smoke detector in every bedroom for new construction. On floors without bedrooms, detectors should be installed in or near living areas, such as dens, living rooms, or family rooms.

Mount Detectors Installation: Because smoke rises, Wall mounted units should be installed so that the top of the detector is 4 to 12 inches from the ceiling. A ceiling mounted detector should be installed at least four inches from the nearest wall. In a room with a pitched ceiling, mount the detector at or near the ceiling's highest point.

In stairways with no doors at the top or bottom, position detectors anywhere in the path of smoke moving up the stairs. But always position smoke detectors at the bottom of closed stairways, such as those leading to the basement, because dead air trapped near the door at the top of the stairway could prevent smoke from reaching a detector located at the top. Don't install a smoke detector too near a window, door, or forced air register where drafts could interfere with the detectors operation.

Maintenance: ONLY A FUNCTIONING smoke detector can protect you.

- Never disable a smoke detector by "borrowing" its battery for another use.
- Following the manufacturer's instructions, test all smoke detectors monthly and install new batteries at least once a year. A good reminder is when you change your clocks in the Spring or Fall: change your clock, change your battery.
- Clean your smoke detectors using a vacuum cleaner without removing the detectors cover.
- Never paint a smoke detector.
