

Summer safety reminder list:

- Car Safety: make sure your kids have the right safety car seats

Animal Control:

Leash Law: It is against the law for the owner or custodian of any animal to allow the animal to run atlarge. Any dog or cat that is found at-large may be impounded. A Violation Notice may be issued by a City Police Officer or Animal Control Officer to the owner of an animal found at-large.

Stray Dogs and Cats: Anyone who picks up a stray animal must immediately notify and turn the animal over to the Animal Control Facility.

Removal of Excrement: The owner or custodian of any dog or cat is required to remove their pet's excrement from public or private property.

It is with deep sorrow that we have to report that we have lost a member of our family.

On February 26, 2015 Captain David Ladd passed away after a long illness.

Captain Ladd was the second Police Officer hired for the newly formed New Carrollton Police. This police department was formed after a referendum by the City residents, who wanted a more effective, community oriented police force to enhance their quality of life. Chief David Rice was hired to start the police department and very shortly thereafter Chief Rice brought David Ladd aboard. These two began working

immediately to address the communities concerns making the City of New Carrollton a safer place to live and do business. The addition of Officers Marc Butler and Vince Lyew, solidified the team that would be the foundation of the New Carrollton Police Department.

Dave Ladd spent his life in service to his community. In his younger days he was a volunteer firefighter with the Bowie Volunteer Fire Department. He began his law enforcement career as a public safety dispatcher with the University of Maryland Police Department. He was subsequently hired by the Prince George's County Community College where he attended the Prince Georges County Police Department Police Academy and received his certification as a Maryland Police Officer. Dave has served the Citizens of the Town of Berwyn Heights, Edmonston, Cottage City, Fairmont Heights and finally New Carrollton; where he retired with the rank of Captain.

Dave's service to his community as a member of the law enforcement community exceeded 26 years, during that time he touched many lives and made good friends who loved him and will dearly miss him.


The Department of Public Works' main objectives is to keep the city's infrastructure intact.

The change of using only small trucks on small streets has resulted in zero reported incidents of damage to citizen's vehicles. The plan is working better each time and the equipment performed with minimum down time.

Spring and summer are here and the flowers are starting to bloom, I ask all citizens to please use caution when passing workers maintaining the malls and running mowers.

- Residents: **WSSC** has accomplished a repaired to a main water leak on 86th and Powhatan Street.
- The Department of Public Works continue removing stumps around the City.
- Street maintenance has finished filling potholes around the city. If a citizen shall find one that we missed or has developed please notify Public Works at 301-577-1008.
- If you should approach a pothole while driving please slow down and approach with caution; try to drive over it versus in it.
- The Department of Public Works is currently working with Pepco to replace trees that have been taken down around the city.
- Citizens are reminded that as they are doing their spring yard cleanup Public Works Department collect **yard waste** on the second trash day of the week (**Thursday or Friday**). Leaves and clippings must be in Paper bags and sticks and branches must be cut to four (4) foot lengths and bundle with string not to exceed 50 pounds. Yard waste may be placed near the trash cans and we will bring it to the curb.

Recycling Bins: Helping the City go green 65 gallons at a time. All City residents should be in possession of one blue and yellow 65 gallon bin. If your bin has been stolen please contact the Department of Public Works during regular business hours.

IMPORTANT CHANGES TO MARYLAND'S LEAD RISK REDUCTION IN HOUSING ACT.

- 1. Effective January 1, 2015, all residential rental properties built prior to 1978 must be registered with the Maryland Department of the Environment. These properties must undergo lead inspections **in addition** to your annual city inspection.
- 2. The state registration fee is \$30.00 per unit.
- 3. City rental license's will not be issued until all compliance requirements are met and properties are registered with the state.

Building Permits: To help ensure that new structures are safe, and do not violate building restrictions, a city permit is required for any new construction, improvements, or demolition to your property. As a general rule, permits are not required for repairs that are non-structural in nature.

City permits are available from the New Carrollton Municipal Center.

When applying for a city permit you must include a plat plan or detailed drawing and an estimate of the cost of construction. You will also be asked to provide the following information:

- Address of proposed construction
- Name, address and telephone number of property owner
- Use of property (Residential/Commercial)
- Projected start date
- Work description
- Name, address and telephone of the contractor (when applicable)
- Contractor license number
- County permit number (when applicable)
- Estimated cost

Permits are generally issued or denied within 5 business days. To find out if a county permit is needed, call the county permit office at 301-883-5855, from 8:30 AM to 4 PM, Monday through Friday. If a county permit is required, it must be obtained first, and a copy submitted with your application for a city permit.

Construction safety is very important. Any equipment and materials left at a project site overnight should be secured in a non-hazardous manner.




