Effective July 1, 2015, the City of New Carrollton Public Works Department will be handling the **Call-A-Bus** program. The new number to call for questions and reservations is **301-577-1008**.

The New Carrollton **Call-A-Bus** offers lift-equipped, door to door **free** transportation for New Carrollton Senior Citizens (age 55 and older), individuals with disabilities and

veterans for medical appointments, hospital visits, shopping and social activities within a **5 mile radius**.

48 Hour advance reservation is required, appointments are scheduled on a first-come first serve basis, priority is given to seniors and individual with disabilities going to medical appointments.

Individuals with children four years of age and under must be secured in a child safety seat provided by the adult passenger.

This service is available Monday through Friday from 9:15 a.m. until 2:30 p.m. (Except on holidays or if Prince George's County schools are closed or even delayed due to harsh weather).

Mosquito Control Information.

The Maryland Department of Agriculture will continue to emphasize modern pest management principles in their **mosquito control programs**. Abatement efforts will include major emphasis on control at the source (**larviciding**) whenever possible.

- Property owners are encouraged to remove any unnecessary water holding containers.
- Spraying for adult mosquitoes will be based strictly on results from standardized surveillance methods.
- The City of New Carrollton will be scheduled for adult mosquito surveillance and possible spraying on **Thursday** nights.
- **Adulticiding will begin June 1, 2015 and will run through September 17, 2015.**
- The action threshold is 3 female mosquitoes in 2 minutes in a landing rate count or 24 female mosquitoes in a baited light trap, This will influence the amount of spraying done for adult mosquitoes.
- Due to the variable weather conditions and other factors, surveillance or spraying is not guaranteed to be done in any given week even if complaints are been received.

There has been a surge in the urban mosquito population due to the introduction of the **Asian Tiger Mosquito "ATM"**. The **Asian Tiger Mosquito** displays a strong preference for breeding in small man-made containers such as flower pots, trash cans, tires, buckets, etc.

- The Asian Tiger Mosquito does not breed in wetlands or waterways. Its breeding habits and a very short flight range of less than a quarter mile, the source of a **Asian Tiger Mosquito** can typically be found in one's backyard.
- **Asian Tiger Mosquito's** association with human habitation and persistent daytime biting make the **Asian Tiger Mosquito** a particularly troubling mosquito in urban and suburban settings.

Program staff can assist residents by identifying actual **Asian Tiger Mosquito breeding containers**, but it is the resident's responsibility to use this information to locate and eliminate additional breeding sites on their property.

Individuals, communities and businesses are strongly urged to take a proactive stance in the fight against the **Asian Tiger Mosquito**.

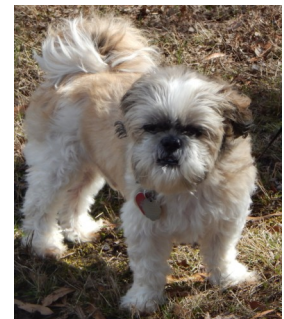

People don't come with airbags, street safety tips for pedestrians, bicyclists, and drivers.

Translation in Spanish is on the right

For Pedestrians:

- Cross the street at marked crosswalks and intersections.
- Watch for turning vehicles before crossing, look left, right, then left again.
- Use pedestrian pushbuttons.
- Begin crossing the street on the "walk" signal.
- Stay visible after dark and in bad weather.
- Watch out for trucks and buses backing out of parking spaces and driveways.

For Bicyclist:

- Obey all regulatory signs and traffic lights.
- Never ride against traffic ride with traffic to avoid potential accidents.
- Use hand signals to tell motorists what you intend to do.
- Ride in a straight line at least a car door's width away from parked cars.
- Always wear a helmet helmets dramatically reduce the risk for head injury in a bicycle accident.
- Use lights at night and when visibility is poor.

For Drivers:

- Stop for pedestrians at crosswalks and be careful when passing stopped vehicles.
- Slow down and obey the posted speed limit.
- Yield to pedestrians and bicyclists when turning.
- Look before opening your door.
- Allow 3 feet when passing bicyclists.



- Disminuir la velocidad y obedecer los límites de velocidad.
- Los conductores deben ceder el paso a los peatones cuando doblan.
- Mirar antes de abrir la puerta.

**Overgrown Weeds & Vegetation Encroachment**

Every spring, or after the rains have subsided, you may notice that weeds and overgrowth of various types start appearing throughout the community. The overgrowth is commonly found in residential yards, open areas, or encroaching upon public right-of-ways. What exactly is the city's policy or ordinances regarding overgrown weeds and vegetation?

In the City of New Carrollton, it has been deemed a public nuisance for a property owner to allow the overgrowth of grasses, weeds, shrubs or other vegetation that could harbor rodents, mosquitoes, vermin, or constitute a fire hazard.

It is the property owner's duty and responsibility to keep their property cleared of overgrown vegetation, and the front and back lawns mowed before the grass reaches a height of eight (8) inches. Additionally, the public right-of-way (area between the street and sidewalk) must be maintained, and is the responsibility of the property owner. Grass and weeds that grow around utility poles or sign posts should also be cut or "weed wacked".

As trees and landscaping grow, They tend to encroach upon public fairways (sidewalks, paths, or streets). This encroachment has also been deemed a public nuisance in the city code and constitutes a hazard, which impedes the free movement of pedestrians or vehicle traffic. Hedges and shrubs that border a sidewalk or path in the city may not be any higher than forty-eight (48") inches above grade level. Tree branches and foliage which overhangs a sidewalk must be maintained, and shall not impede the free passage of our residents. Additionally, property owners may not permit the growth of any hedges, shrubs or trees on a corner lot that constitutes an obstruction to the vision of motorists.

DEPARTMENT OF CODE ENFORCEMENT**Motor Vehicle Repairs**

Regular preventive maintenance is probably the single most important thing you can do as a car owner. Maintaining your vehicle now will save you costly repairs in the future. However, not everyone agrees on what vehicle maintenance is, what you can do, and when you should do it. Let's clear that up, and take a look at the city code of ordinances.

The Department of Code Enforcement receives numerous complaints of vehicle repairs and maintenance being performed within the city. Often it is accompanied by the question: Is this type of work permitted in New Carrollton? Well, there are several factors that must be considered, but more often than not the answer is yes, it is permitted.

While some may elect to take their vehicle to an automotive shop, some more experienced residents may wish to do the required services on their own. The basics, like changing your oil, coolant, filters, tires, headlamps, bulbs, belts and batteries are all tasks that are considered incidental maintenance. These repairs, and others that require similar time and expense are also permitted on private property in the city.

Repair and Maintenance

Repairs and maintenance of vehicles may be performed in driveways and carports provided they meet the following criteria

- The vehicle must be registered to the owner/legal occupant of the property and registered at that address.
- The repairs are performed by the owner/ legal occupant of the property.
- The repairs do not include removal or replacement of any engine, transmission, differential or structural body part.
- All repairs/maintenance shall only occur between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. and must be completed within forty-eight (48) hours.
- All tools, supplies, parts and miscellaneous equipment must be removed from the public view no later than 7:00 p.m. This includes all jacks and car ramps.
- All excess or used oil, coolant or other non-biodegradable fluids must be disposed of at a lawful disposal site. The Department of Public Works has an available disposal container onsite.

Prohibited Acts

It is unlawful to perform any repairs or maintenance (with the exception of emergency maintenance to move a vehicle off the street) on any motor vehicle that is on a city street, property, or within a city right-of-way.
