Public Notice - Snow Emergency

From the Code of the City of New Carrollton Chapter 100 - 5 Part C 1-3(a)

In case of a City declared snow and/or ice emergency, the Mayor or his/her designee may restrict on-street parking during said emergencies or other emergency conditions on all streets maintained by the City where parking is permitted on both sides of the street. [Added 3-21-2007 by Ord. No. 07-11]

- (1) During a snow emergency, parking is permitted only in driveways or on the evennumbered side of the street. While such restriction is in effect, vehicles shall remain parked on
 the even-numbered side of the street until the next calendar day following such time as the condition causing this restriction is cleared from the odd-numbered unparked side of the street at
 which time all vehicles must be moved to the odd-numbered side to facilitate clearing of the
 even-numbered side. During the snow emergency, the City will allow vehicles parked in driveways to temporarily block the sidewalk in order to accommodate the maximum number of vehicles. Sidewalks must be cleared of vehicles within the twenty-four-hour period following the
 cessation of the snow fall and the subsequent clearing of both sides of the street. With the exception of sidewalk areas within driveways, nothing in this plan permits parking in other areas
 in which parking is otherwise prohibited.
- (2) Implementation of a snow, ice or other emergency situation requiring parking restrictions shall be publicized on the City Comcast television Channel 71 and on Metro area television and radio public broadcasts, with said broadcasts deemed sufficient for enforcement of this plan.
- (3) Any vehicle which is parked in violation of this plan shall be issued a citation for such violation and be subject to being towed and impounded by the City Police Department. [Amended 2-17-2010 by Ord. No. 10-12]
- (a) ANY PERSON ISSUED A CITATION FOR A VIOLATION OF THIS PLAN SHALL BE SUBJECT TO A FINE OF TWO HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLAARS (\$250.).

Volunteers continue to provide the City Staff with a tremendous amount of support in helping to organize, plan, and execute the City's events. A City Welcome Committee was established in 1986 to welcome new residents who were moving into the City. The Welcome Committee provides each new resident with a welcome packet that contains information on City services and pamphlets of information. The committee operates through a group of volunteers. New Carrollton opened the City's Dog park on November 18, with a ribbon, cutting ceremony. The park is located at West Field Park (6300 block of Westbrook Drive). I would like to thank Mrs. Barbara Goldsmith, of the Prince George's County Nutrition Program, the New Carrollton Fraternal Order of Police Lodge #137, and City employees, who purchased food packages that were donated to area residents in need.

MAYOR'S WINTER ESSENTIAL TIPS

As colder weather approaches, I encourage all residents to prepare their homes for the winter heating season by practicing energy efficiency, including the following low-cost or no-cost tips:

- Change or clean furnace/air filters once a month and schedule an annual furnace or boiler check-up with a licensed professional.
- Caulk and weather-strip around doors and windows.
- Install rubber gaskets behind outlet and switch plates.
- Turn the water heater down to warm or low settings, never more than 120 degrees Fahrenheit.
- Wash full loads of laundry and dishes.
- Use cold water for laundry using specially formulated cold-water detergents.
- Consider installing new, high-efficiency appliances.
- Look for the ENERGY STAR energy-efficient product label.
- Consider purchasing a programmable thermostat, which automatically lowers the temperature setting at night and increases the setting during the day.

ENERGY ASSISTANCE:

Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) or (Maryland Energy Assistance Program). Through this program, the Federal Government distributes funds to the states which, in turn, give grants to qualified applicants to help them pay their energy bills. Residents must complete an application (MEAP) through the Prince George's County Department of Social Services, 425 Brightseat Road, Landover, Maryland 20785.

A reminder to all residents to protect yourself during the frigid weather forecast. Residents are encouraged to take precautionary measures from exposure to the cold to prevent hypothermia. Stay informed and utilize the County's improved notification system: **Notify Me Prince George's.** All residents are encouraged to sign up for this new system and get connected to the latest weather alerts and updates. residents should also monitor the weather through local media sources.

Remember to call **911** only in cases of emergency.

Residents are encouraged to utilize Prince George's County's (CountyClick 311) system to obtain information. In addition, I encourage residents to assist their neighbors by utilizing a "buddy system" to help check on individuals who are elderly or have functional needs to ensure that they are safe and warm.

POWER LOSS REMINDER:

In the event of a power outage, Stocking up on shelf-life condiments and canned goods comes in handy.

(Don't forget a manual can opener!)

Its recommended that you turn off or disconnect any electrical devices that were in use when the power went out. this is because surges or spikes in power can harm equipment when the power comes back on.

The City of New Carrollton has two community gardens that are open to residents interested in gardening. One is located on Lamont Drive and the second one is located at St. Christopher's Episcopal Church, 8001 Annapolis Road, New Carrollton.

St. Christopher's was visited by a representative of Food for the Poor. As a result of the visit, our youth embarked on a project to raise funds to purchase a water pump for those in need.

The gardeners at St. Christopher' planted Jerusalem artichokes for the St. Christopher's youth to sell at their fundraiser.

When the first freeze came, the Jerusalem artichokes were ready for harvest! On Saturday, November 1, both community gardeners and St. Christopher's youth met to collect the artichokes. After the youth wards cleaned and bagged them. They sold out and brought in \$230 – enough for the water pump and to provide meals for 400 children.

The St. Christopher's community are thankful to Mayor Hanko and City staff for all their support in making the garden a reality, including the help in its installation and smooth operation. We look forward to future collaboration between the gardeners and St. Christopher's youth and more outreach possibilities.

How to protect yourself from scams:

Almost everyone will be approached by a scammer at some stage in their lives. Some scams are very easy to spot, while other scams may appear to be genuine offers or bargains. Scams can even take place without you doing anything at all.

- Most scams need you to do something before they can work., you may send money to someone based on a
 promise that turns out to be false.
- You may give your personal details to people who turn out to be scammers. Some scams rely on you agreeing to deals without getting advice first or buying a product without checking it out properly.
- The simple tips listed below will help you protect yourself and your family from scams.
- Scams can cost people a lot of money and cause a great deal of distress., by following these simple tips, you can protect yourself against scams.

Golden Rules:

- If it looks too good to be true—it probably is.
- **ALWAYS** get independent advice if an offer involves significant money, time or commitment.
- Remember that there are no get-rich-quick schemes; the only people who make money are the scammers.
- Do not agree to offers or deals straight-away: tell the person that you are not interested or that you want to get some independent advice before making a decision.
- **NEVER** send money or give credit card or online account details to anyone you do not know and trust.
- Check your bank account and credit card statements when you get them. If you see a transaction you cannot explain, report it to your credit card or bank.
- Very Important to keep your credit and ATM cards safe.
- Do not share your personal identity number with anyone.
- Do not keep any written copy of your PIN with the card.

New Carrollton Police - Fraud Awareness Tips

Digging a little deeper: do not let anyone pressure you into making decisions about money or investments!

Always get independent financial advice!

Read all the terms and conditions of any offer very carefully. claims of free or very cheap offers often have hidden costs. Make sure you know how to stop any subscription service you want to sign up for.

Be very careful about offers for medicines, supplements or other treatments, always seek the advice of your health care professional. Remember there are no magic pills or safe options for rapid weight loss.

Beware of products or schemes that claim to guarantee income or winnings.

If someone offers you an investment or other financial service, ask for their Financial Services License number!

- Be wary of investments promising a high return with little or no risk,
- Beware of job offers that require you to pay an upfront fee.

Protect your identity: Only give out your personal details and information where it is absolutely necessary and where you have initiated the contact and trust the other party.

Order a free copy of **your credit report** every year to make sure no one is using your name to borrow money or run-up debts.

Sending or transferring money:

- Never send money to anyone you are not totally sure about.
- Do not send any money or pay any fee to claim a prize or lottery winnings.
- Money laundering is a criminal offense: do not agree to transfer money for someone else.

Telephone traps

If you receive a phone call out of the blue, always ask for the name of the person you are speaking to and who they represent.

Dealing with suspicious or unsolicited offers sent by email or SMS

Do not open suspicious or unsolicited emails (spam): delete them.

IRS Scams: The Federal Government never calls you so If you get a phone call from someone claiming to be from the IRS, here's what you should do:

- If you know you owe taxes or you think you might owe taxes, call the IRS at 1.800.829.1040. The IRS employees at that line can help you with a payment issue if there really is such an issue.
- If you know you don't owe taxes or have no reason to think that you owe any taxes (for example, you've never received a bill or the caller made some bogus threats as described above), then call and report the incident to the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration at 1.800.366.4484.
- You can file a complaint using the <u>FTC Complaint Assistant</u>; choose "Other" and then "Imposter Scams." If the complaint involves someone impersonating the IRS, include the words "IRS Telephone Scam" in the notes.

Taxpayers should be aware that there are other unrelated scams (such as a lottery sweepstakes) and solicitations (such as debt relief) that fraudulently claim to be from the IRS.

Be Prepared for the Snow and Wintry Weather!

§100-12 It shall be the duty of every person, partnership, firm or corporation, whether as a tenant, occupant or property owner, having control of any building or parcel of land abutting on a paved public sidewalk, to remove and clear away or cause to be removed and cleared away any snow or sleet from the portion of the public sidewalk which abuts on said building or parcel of land within 24 hours... after the ceasing to fall of any such snow or sleet.

(1) Should the owner or person responsible for the maintenance of the property fail to remove the snow or sleet from the abutting sidewalk within twenty-four (24) hours of the cessation of any snow or sleet event, the City shall have the right to remove such snow or sleet from the sidewalk. The owner or person responsible for the maintenance of the property shall bear the cost of removal. After thirty (30) days from the issuance of an invoice, any abatement costs that remain unpaid shall be recorded as a lien against the property and collected by entering same on the tax records of such property.

REMINDER: RESIDENTS PUT AWAY YOUR CHRISTMAS TREE AND LIGHTING DECORATIONS

There are some basic maintenance matters that homeowners can take care of to prevent fires.

- Clean clutter from around your furnace and water heaters.
- Visually inspect your furnace, ventilation pipes, and chimneys for any obvious signs of damage.
- Install and maintain smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors in your home and place of work. Test alarms monthly, and replace batteries at least once-a-year.

STREET LIGHTS IN NEW CARROLLTON

PEPCO is the company responsible for street lights to be repaired, therefore when residents call City Hall to report lights out, The City reports this to **PEPCO**. Residents are encouraged to visit (**www.pepco.com**). **Click on the option CONNECT WITH US: REPORT A STREET LIGHT OUTAGE**, and make sure to have the address and pole number to the light that is out and an email address as Pepco does reply to notify that they received the complaint. Or just call City Hall and they will report it to Pepco. **301-459-6100**


