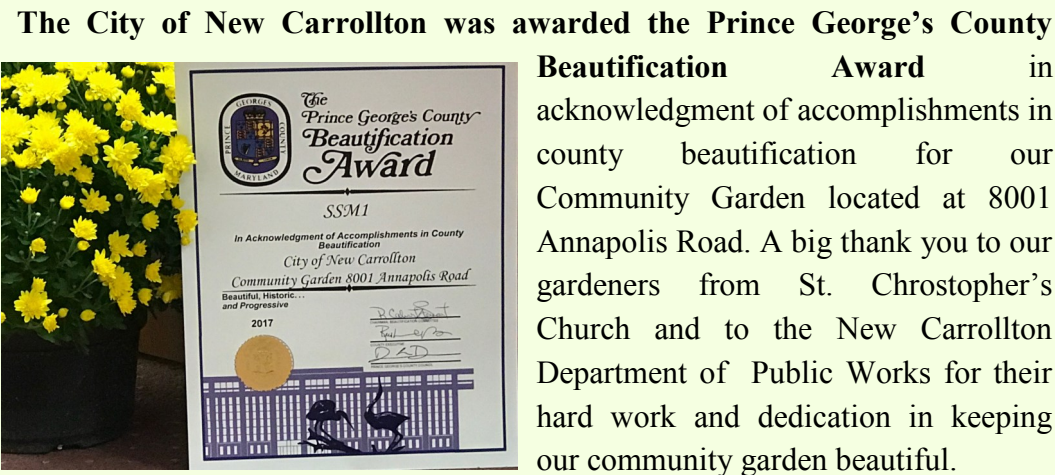

#### Award of Contract for Municipal Center Roof

### **Snow and Ice Emergency Plan - Declaration of a Snow Emergency**

Chapter 100-5 of the New Carrollton Code governs Declarations of Snow Emergencies:

In the event of a predicted or actual snow fall of four inches (4”) or more, alternative parking shall be authorized on all streets maintained by the City where parking is permitted.

During a snow event of four inches (4”) or more, alternative parking will allow citizens to park vehicles on sidewalks and grassy areas of their own property for the sole purpose of clearing the streets for plowing. All vehicles must be moved from sidewalks and grassy areas within 48 hours of the end of the storm. The Public Works Department will plow curb to curb, where possible, immediately after the end of the snow fall. There will be no more attempts made thereafter to plow curb to curb. Streets with cars parked on them will not be cleared curb to curb.

A snow, ice or other event that requires the implementation of allowing alternate parking shall be publicized on the City Comcast television Channel 71 and City Verizon television Channel 30 along with the City’s Website ([www.newcarrolltonmd.gov](http://www.newcarrolltonmd.gov)) and social media outlets (Facebook and Twitter). The City will also publicize the information on Metro area television and radio public broadcasts, with said broadcasts deemed sufficient for enforcement of this plan.

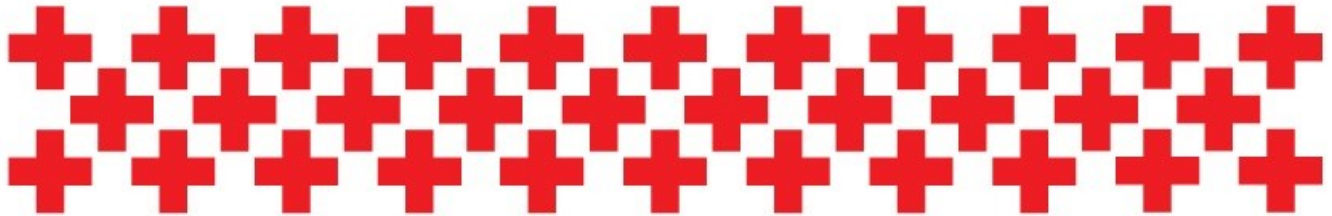
It shall be unlawful to clear snow from private property and to place it in a City street. Snow must be placed in the tree box between the curb and sidewalk. When clearing snow from around a vehicle parked on a street, snow removed from around the vehicle also must be placed in the tree box.

Any vehicle which is parked in such a manner that it blocks normal travel lanes shall be issued a citation for such violation and be subject to being towed and impounded by the City Police Department.

**Any person issued a citation for a violation of this subsection C(4) shall be subject to a fine of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250).**

## Emergency Preparedness

If a disaster strikes in your community, you might not have access to food, water, or electricity for several days. You may think that you will have enough time to run to the grocery store, but stores quickly sell out of important supplies following emergency warnings. Unfortunately, about half of adults in the United States do not have the resources and plans in place for a possible emergency. Preparing emergency kits for your family is an important step in keeping them safe and healthy during a disaster.

### Pack an emergency supply kit. Here's what you'll need:

At Least a 3-day Supply of Food and Water: **Water** – one gallon per person, per day  
**Food** – foods that are easy to make and won't spoil, like canned soup, dry pasta, and powdered milk.

Manual can opener and basic utensils to prepare and serve meals.

**Health Supplies:** 3-day supply of all medicines, at a minimum. Medical supplies like syringes, a walking cane, or hearing aids with extra batteries.

**Personal Care Items:** Soap, Toothbrush and toothpaste, baby wipes, contact lenses or glasses, safety supplies.

First aid kit, emergency blanket, multipurpose tool (that can act as a knife, file, pliers, and screwdriver), whistle, and electronics, flashlight.

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) provides weather updates during emergencies. Look for a radio labeled "NOAA Weather Radio."

Radio (battery-powered, solar, or hand-crank) for updates on the situation, cell phone with chargers and extra batteries.

Check and replace your supplies throughout the year.

Every family is unique. You may have emergency needs not included in this list. Also, remember to update your kit according to changing needs of your family.

### Be sure your emergency kit is ready to use.

In a disaster situation, you may need to get your emergency supply kit quickly, whether you are sheltering at home or evacuating. Once you have gathered your supplies, pack the items in easy-to-carry containers. Clearly label the containers and store them where you can reach them easily. Remember that certain items, like medications and paper documents, need to be kept in waterproof containers.

## Community Information

### Tax Season is right around the corner!

Every year over 500 volunteers at 14 tax sites operated by Community Tax Aid prepare tax returns for low-income individuals and families in the Washington Metropolitan area.

Our New Carrollton site is located at the City Municipal Center (6016 Princess Garden Parkway, New Carrollton, MD 20784). The site is open on Monday and Thursday evenings from February 1<sup>st</sup> through April 15<sup>th</sup>. We ask volunteers to commit to one 4-hour shift per week during the tax season.

We are in need of volunteers to fill any of the following roles:

- Client Coordinator - help clients complete intake documents, ensure that they qualify for our services and review the outcomes with the taxpayer to ensure that they leave with a good understanding of the results.
- Greeters - welcome clients and orient them to the process at the tax site and help manage the flow of clients.
- Tax Preparers - work one-on-one with our clients preparing their federal and state income tax returns, ensuring that they receive all the credits and tax benefits for which they are eligible. Tax preparers must complete an IRS certification test and attend 12 hours of training, offered in January in downtown DC on evenings and weekends.

All of these positions give volunteers the opportunities to work directly with clients and are all crucial to the success of the tax site. The Client Coordinator role is a great opportunity for volunteers who want to work directly with clients but may not have the time to take the necessary tax law training. We are particularly interested in Spanish speaking volunteers!
