

Leash Law: It is against the law for the owner or custodian of any animal to allow the animal to run at-large. Any dog or cat that is found at large may be impounded. A Violation Notice may be issued by a City Police Officer or Animal Control Officer to the owner of an animal found at-large.

Removal of Excrement: The owner or custodian of any dog or cat is required to remove their pet's excrement from public or private property.

Stray Dogs and Cats: Anyone who picks up a stray animal must immediately notify and turn the animal over to the Prince George's County Animal Control Facility.

Dog Waste is Not a Fertilizer!

Picking up after your dog goes further than making your neighbors happy. When you are out walking your dog, it is your duty to collect their waste. The trails and parks we enjoy with our Dogs are adjacent to creeks and reservoirs. Dog waste that is not collected gets carried away during rainstorms to nearby waterways, and can be a significant source of pollution. Dog waste carries harmful bacteria like E. coli, which poses serious health risks if allowed to come in contact with water.

Protect yourself from scams

Scammers are getting increasingly sophisticated in their attempts to get your money or personal details. Be alert and protect yourself from being scammed by following these tips.

Scams target everyone: Scams target people of all backgrounds, ages and income levels. There's no one group of people who are more likely to become a victim of a scam. It's not only the naïve and gullible who fall victim; all of us may be vulnerable to a scam at some time.

Scams succeed because they look like the real thing and catch you off guard when you're not expecting it. They also exploit your desire to be polite and respectful, as well as your generosity, compassion and good nature.

Protect yourself: Be alert to the fact that scams exist. When dealing with uninvited contacts from people or businesses, whether it's over the phone, by mail, email, in person or on a social networking site, always consider the possibility that the approach may be a scam. Remember, if it looks too good to be true, it probably is.

Know who you're dealing with. If you've only ever met someone online or are unsure of the legitimacy of a business, take some time to do a bit more research. Do a Google image search or search the internet for others who may have had dealings with them.

Do-Not open suspicious texts, pop-up windows or emails – delete them: If unsure, verify the identity of the contact through an independent source such as a phone book or online search. Don't use the contact details provided in the message sent to you.

Keep your personal details secure. Shred your bills and other important documents before throwing them out. Keep your passwords and pin numbers in a safe place. Be very careful about how much personal information you share on social media sites. Scammers can use your information and pictures to create a fake identity or to target you with a scam.

Keep your mobile devices and computers secure. Always use password protection, don't share access with others (including remotely), update security software and backup content. Protect your WiFi network with a password and avoid using public computers or WiFi hotspots to access online banking or provide personal information.

Choose your passwords carefully. Choose passwords that would be difficult for others to guess and update them regularly. A strong password should include a mix of upper and lower case letters, numbers and symbols. Don't use the same password for every account/profile, and don't share your passwords with anyone.

Review your privacy and security settings on social media. If you use social networking sites, such as Facebook, be careful who you connect with and learn how to use your privacy and security settings to ensure you stay safe. If you recognize suspicious behavior, clicked on spam or have been scammed online, take steps to secure your account and be sure to report the conduct.

Beware of any requests for your details or money. Never send money or give credit card details, online account details or copies of personal documents to anyone you don't know or trust. Don't agree to transfer money or goods for someone else: money laundering is a criminal offence.

Be careful when shopping online. Be aware of offers that seem too good to be true, and always use an online shopping service that you know and trust. Think twice before using virtual currencies (like bitcoin) - they do not have the same protections as other transaction methods, which means you can't get your money back once you send it. Learn more about online shopping scams.

Department of Code Enforcement

Important Changes to Maryland's Lead Risk Reduction in Housing Act.

All residential rental properties built prior to 1978 must be registered with the Maryland Department of the Environment. These properties must undergo lead inspections in addition to your annual city inspection.

- The state registration fee is \$30.00 per unit.
- City rental license's will not be issued until all compliance requirements are met and properties are registered with the state.

City Code Chapter 41: Building Construction

In order to preserve and maintain the public health, safety and an orderly development within the City of New Carrollton and to avoid encroachments upon building restrictions, it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to erect, construct or repair or anywise change any building, garage, carport or other building or addition thereto, or any other structure, including a wall, fence or barrier of any kind, or to make any other improvements of a permanent nature to or upon any real property within the corporate limits of the City of New Carrollton until plans and specifications for the construction thereof and a plat plan for the lot or parcel of ground upon which the same is to be erected, constructed or altered shall have been submitted to the Mayor of New Carrollton or his or her designee, and a permit issued by the Mayor or his or her designee for the same; provided, however, that permits for construction or reconstruction on any property in a commercial or industrial zone or any construction valued in excess of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) in a residential zone shall be approved by the City Council.

Chapter 100-12 Responsibilities of property owners and tenants.

B. It shall be the duty of every person, partnership, firm or corporation, whether as tenant, occupant or property owner, having control of any building or parcel of land abutting on any improved public right-of-way, to mow or cause to be mowed any grassor other vegetation growing in that portion of the public right-of-way which abuts on said building or parcel of land.
