### MINUTES OF CITY COUNCIL MEETING CITY OF NEW CARROLLTON JANUARY 7, 1998

The regularly scheduled meeting of the City Council of the City of New Carrollton was held in the New Carrollton Municipal Center on Wednesday, January 7, 1998.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Sarah C. Potter. Present were Council Members Raymond J. Garvey, Rose M. Hurdle, and Stephen L. Keleti; Mayor Andrew C. Hanko, Administrative Officer Mark L. Latour, and Public Works Director Richard L. Robbins.

### 1. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE.

Chairman Potter announced that the Pledge of Allegiance would be lead tonight by Cub Scout Troop Number 1015.

Afterwards the leader came to the podium, and he explained that the Scouts here tonight were Weblos, boys 6 1/2 years to ll years old. The Scouts meet on Thursdays at the Good Luck Community Center, and all boys of that age group were invited to join. The leader thanked the Mayor and Council, and Chairman Potter thanked the Scouts for their participation.

### 2. REPORT OF THE MAYOR.

Mayor Hanko reported that a live television informational meeting would be held at the Municipal Center next Wednesday evening, January 14th, at 7:00 p.m., pertaining to preventing sexual assaults. The Mayor then listed steps the residents could take to secure their homes, and he announced that the Police were using an automatic telephone dialer which provide the same information. The Mayor stated that he would invite members of the Prince George's County Police who were involved in disseminating information on this subject, such as officers from Public Relations and Cpl. Mrotek. The meeting would be a live broadcast, and it would be taped so that it could be re-broadcast on Channel B-10. The administration would notify all apartment complexes and condominiums.

Mayor Hanko came to the podium, and he announced the winners of the holiday house judging contest. The prizes were donated by the New Carrollton Recreation Council. The winners in the all-around category were:

3rd place to Mr. & Mrs. Clarence Weaver of 6502 Fairbanks Street; 2nd Place to Mr. & Mrs. Denver Sanders of 6403 85th Place; 1st Place to Mr. & Mrs. Joseph Lloyd of 8103 Legation Road.

The 1st place winner for the most-appealing-to-children category was Mr. & Mrs. Michael Dulski of 6431 Fairbanks Street.

Mayor Hanko extended condolences on behalf of the City to the family of former City Hall Secretary Catherine Arcaro Kilbridge, who recently passed away.

Mayor Hanko thanked the New Carrollton Garden Club for supplying the judges for the house decorating contest and the New Carrollton Recreation Council for supplying the awards to the winners.

Mayor Hanko reported that Santa visited the sick children and the elderly shut-in's on Christmas Eve. The City supplied small presents for those visited.

Mayor Hanko thanked all City volunteers who offered their services during the holiday season.

Mayor Hanko reported that he and Mr. Latour met with Prince George's County Budget Director, Mr. Brown, and Mr. Stan Early on December 23rd regarding the City's tax differential. The Mayor explained the situation to the gentlemen, and he stated that he would send the County a letter including a number of reasons why he feels that the County should at least consider giving the City of New Carrollton a tax differential such as they gave to Colmar Manor for support.

Mayor Hanko reported that he attended a luncheon with Governor Glendening of the Intergovernmental Council, which included officials of MACO (representing counties), MML (representing cities), and the State of Maryland. At the luncheon the Governor mentioned that he was inclined to sign the MML's proposed bill regarding the Foreign Vehicle Registration Enforcement Incentive Program, if the bill was approved by the Legislators.

Mayor Hanko reported that he would be meeting with Mr. Kevin Nowak of the Maryland State Highway Administration to review the side walk construction plans for both sides of Route 450.

Mayor Hanko reported that the Reverend Chris Yancey, President of the Brotherly Love International Organization, had secured a space at the Carrollton Mall; and he had asked that the Mayor invite the City Council Members and the residents to attend the dedication ceremony at the Mall this Saturday, January 10th at 2:00 p.m. The Mayor stated that this was a very worthwhile and necessary organization which included many programs and activities for teenagers.

At this time Mayor Hanko extended a Christmas greeting to all residents celebrating the Russian Christmas on January 6th.

Public Works Director Robbins reported that the leaf collections had been completed, and he stated that raked leaves could be placed in bags and left for the second refuse collection. Leaf collection trucks were now being prepared to deal with possible snow, and therefore, the trucks could no longer pick up leaves at the curb.

Council Member Hurdle commented on the meeting regarding the tax differential, which the Mayor attended. Mrs. Hurdle mentioned a memo containing inaccurate figures, which was given to the Council from the Mayor. The information in the memo had been compiled from the Prince George's County Police reports and not from the reports of the City Contract Officers. Mrs. Hurdle asked the Mayor to make sure that the County received the correct figures, and Mayor Hanko assured her that he would.

Mrs. Hurdle announced that the AMC movie theaters at Carrollton Mall were now closed, and she asked the Mayor why the City had not been notified by the Mall owner and management. Mayor Hanko stated that Mr. Harrison had informed the Council at a workshop that the theaters would be closing in January, and that there were two companies interested in taking over the operation.

Council Member Garvey stated that he agreed with the Mayor about the theaters, and that he remembered Mr. Harrison stating this a few months ago.

Council Member Keleti mentioned to the Mayor that he had received a telephone call from a new member of the Public Safety and Health Committee that there were street lights out, and Mr. Keleti had called PEPCO about the problem.

At this time Chairman Potter stated that item 12 on the agenda was the Treasurer's Report, and she saw no need to delay this report tonight.

### 12. REPORT OF THE TREASURER.

Treasurer Rosenberg reported that there were 91 invoices, totaling \$91,027.01. He had reviewed those invoices and recommended that they be approved for payment. Council Member Garvey moved that the bills be approved as presented and a copy be attached to the minutes of tonight's meeting. Council Member Keleti seconded the motion, and it was approved (4-0).

# 3. CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES OF THE DECEMBER 15, 1997, COUNCIL WORKSHOP MEETING.

Council Member Hurdle moved that the minutes be approved as presented. Council Member Keleti seconded the motion, and it was approved (4-0).

### CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES OF THE DECEMBER 17, 1997, COUNCIL MEETING.

Council Member Keleti moved that the minutes be approved as presented. Council Member Hurdle seconded the motion. Council Member Garvey stated that because there was a death in his family, he was not present at that meeting; and therefore he would abstain from voting. Chairman Potter called for the vote, and the motion was approved (3-0).

### 4. REPORTS OF THE COUNCIL.

Council Member Garvey urged residents to keep their outdoor lights on in an effort to deter criminals. Now that the holidays were over the City would be a little darker.

Council Member Hurdle also extended her condolences to the Arcaro and Kilbridge family, and she stated that Mrs. Kilbridge, a long-time friend, would be greatly missed.

Mrs. Hurdle urged residents to be especially cautious at this time of the year when out on the streets by themselves.

Mrs. Hurdle stated that the vendors of the computer shows at the Ramada Hotel should be aware of the recently enacted City ordinance requiring licenses and permits.

Administrative Officer Latour explained that the Ramada had been notified of this, and the officials there had been cooperating with the City.

Mrs. Hurdle reported that there was a white squirrel residing in the Vera Cope Weinbach Park, and she stated that there was a community in Illinois where those animals were prevalent.

Chairman Potter presented a brief summary of what the Council would be doing, and she stated that it was presently reviewing a drug and alcohol policy for the City and a sexual harassment policy. The City Attorney was working with the Council on the Code of Ordinances, Chapters 100, 114, and 118, and he would also be preparing a letter for Mayor Hanko to hand carry to the MML regarding the eviction laws. The Council would be looking at the municipal infraction fines, and the Attorney had recommended that the fines be increased.

Chairman Potter stated that the next Council workshop meeting would be on Tuesday, January 20, 1997, at 7:00 p.m., because of the holiday on Monday (the regularly scheduled meeting night).

At this time Chairman Potter announced that Council Member John A. Schaffer was excused from the meeting tonight.

### 5. ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA BY THE COUNCIL.

There were no additions.

6. PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT RESOLUTION NO. 97-05 TO CHANGE THE RECALL PROCESS; THE ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER IS ALREADY PERFORMING MANY OF THE JOBS OF THE TREASURER, AND THE LANGUAGE OF THE CHARTER SHOULD BE AMENDED TO REFLECT THIS; THE APPOINTMENT OF AN ACTING ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER SHOULD BE MADE WITH THE CONSENT OF THE COUNCIL; AND THAT THE WORDING OF THE CHARTER RELATED TO THE USE OF THE BUDGET SURPLUS SHOULD BE CLARIFIED; AND THAT THE DOLLAR AMOUNT WHICH REQUIRES FORMAL, SEALED COMPETITIVE BIDS SHOULD BE INCREASED.

Chairman Potter stated that she could not accept telephone calls, and she asked if anyone in the audience wished to come forward to testify. Mrs. Potter then read a letter from Mrs. Mary T. Miller, which would be considered as written testimony.

There was no other testimony, and therefore, Chairman Potter declared the public hearing held.

7. PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 97-10 TO AMEND SECTION 6-4 ENTITLED "BUDGET AMENDMENTS" OF CHAPTER 6 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF NEW CARROLLTON, MARYLAND, 1997 EDITION, ENTITLED "BUDGET AND FINANCES" TO EXPEDITE THE PROCESSING OF ROUTINE BUDGET AMENDMENTS.

Chairman Potter stated that she could not accept telephone calls, and she asked if anyone in the audience wished to come forward to testify. Mrs. Potter then read another letter from Mrs. Mary T. Miller, which would be considered as testimony.

There was no other testimony, and therefore, Chairman Potter declared the public hearing held.

8. PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 97-11 TO REPEAL AND RE-ENACT SECTION 41-4 ENTITLED "WALLS AND FENCES" OF CHAPTER 41 ENTITLED "BUILDING CONSTRUCTION" OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF NEW CARROLLTON, MARYLAND, 1997 EDITION, FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROHIBITING FENCES BEYOND THE FRONT CORNER OF ANY RESIDENTIAL STRUCTURE ON CORNER LOTS (PUBLIC HEARING ON JANUARY 7, 1998).

Chairman Potter stated that she could not accept telephone calls, and she asked if anyone from the audience wished to come forward to testify.

Mrs. Potter stated that this was the second public hearing on this item, and as there was no testimony, she declared the public hearing held.

# 9. SUSPENSION OF THE RULES IN ORDER TO HEAR FROM CITIZENS - 10 MIN. LIMIT.

#### A. AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION.

Mrs. Josephine Oliver, 8310 Nicholson Street, came to the podium and presented a history of some of the letters regarding Police issues which she had written to the City officials requesting assistance and whether or not, in her opinion, she had received an appropriate response.

Mrs. Oliver mentioned that she had been instrumental in making City crime figures available to the residents, and that she would continue to compile data for reports on this subject.

Mrs. Oliver then circulated copies of her most recent report regarding the City Contract Police Officers, which she commented on, and then she thanked the Council for allowing her to come forward.

#### B. TELEPHONE PARTICIPATION.

Mr. Arthur Miller, 6308 Westbrook Drive, telephoned regarding the City Contract Police Officers, and he stated that he did not often see them working in the City. Mr. Miller mentioned a recent incident at 6310 Westbrook Drive, which is a group home for the elderly; and he stated that the Contract Officers should have offered assistance there.

### 10. UNFINISHED BUSINESS.

Council Member Garvey moved that this item remain on the table. Council Member Keleti seconded the motion, and it was approved (4-0) as tabled.

### 11. NEW BUSINESS.

Item No. 0198-01 Award of Bid for New City Entrance Sign at 85th Avenue and Route 450.

Council Member Hurdle reported that this was good news regarding the City sign which was recently knocked down by a motorist. Mrs. Hurdle explained how the bids had been sent out, and she stated that one had been accepted. The motorist's insurance company had sent the City a check for \$1,355, which would be used for the reconstruction of the sign.

There were no footings in the old sign, and the Public Works Department would construct the footings for the new sign; thus saving the City approximately \$500, with a completion date in early spring.

Mrs. Hurdle, therefore, moved that the bid be awarded to A. Volpe & Sons, Inc. of College Park, Maryland. Council Member Garvey seconded the motion, and it was approved (4-0).

Item No. 0198-02 Waiver to Boys' and Girls' Club to Charge Admission, Serve Wine and Beer, and to hold a Valentine's Day Dance and Fundraiser on Saturday, February 14, until 12:30 A.M. in the New Carrollton Municipal Center.

Council Member Hurdle explained this item, and she stated that the Council had set a cap of 175 people who could attend the dance. Another stipulation required by the Council was that the Boys' and Girls' Club, at the Club's expense, would provide 2 off-duty police officers as security for the event.

Mrs. Hurdle stated that the Council had reviewed the application, and she then moved that it be approved. Council Member Keleti seconded the motion, and it was approved (4-0).

Item No. 0198-03 Building Permit Request for the Ramada at 8500 Annapolis Road.

Council Member Keleti explained that this permit was for the re-roofing of the Hotel, which was already in progress and would proceed weather permitting. Mr. Keleti then moved that the permit be approved. Council Member Garvey seconded the motion, and it was approved (4-0).

Item No. 0198-04 Request for Extension of Time Before Towing Vehicle from Janet Raynes, 5912 89th Avenue.

Council Member Keleti explained the vehicle request, and he stated that Code Enforcement had recommended that an extension be granted until January 19. Mr. Keleti moved that this extension be granted. Council Member Hurdle seconded the motion, and it was approved (4-0).

Item No. 0198-05 Request for Extension of Time Before Towing Two Vehicles from Keith Bazemore, 8400 Carrollton Parkway.

Council Member Garvey explained this request involving two vehicles, one of which may have D. C. license tags. Mr. Garvey stated that there was a stipulation that both vehicles be registered in the State of Maryland, and he moved that an extension be granted until January 22. Council Member Keleti seconded the motion, and it was approved (4-0).

# 13. SUSPENSION OF THE RULES IN ORDER TO HEAR FROM CITIZENS - 10 MIN. LIMIT.

### A. AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION.

Ms. Cheryl Steinberg of the City camera crew came to the podium to ask about the meaning of the red turn arrow at the intersection of Route 450 and Princess Garden Parkway. Council Member Garvey explained that this was similar to a stop sign, and that motorists could proceed with caution after stopping; thus, making a right hand turn at the red light.

### B. TELEPHONE PARTICIPATION.

Ms. June Lyles, 5903 Westbrook Terrace, telephoned to report on an incident recently when City Contract Police Officer Cpl. Easter willingly rendered assistance to her and her husband after their vehicle had become disabled.

Ms. Rhonda Ceema, 6107 84th Avenue, telephoned to ask if there was a composite drawing of the suspect(s) in the sexual assault case. Mayor Hanko stated that he would ask Lt. Oliverio, and if a composite drawing existed, it would be broadcast on Channel B-10.

Ms. Yolanda Haskins, 6506 Jodie Street, telephoned to inform the Mayor and Council that she felt they were doing a great job. Ms. Haskins then asked about the street lights which were still out on Good Luck Road, and Mayor Hanko stated that all of the lights there would soon be upgraded.

Ms. Haskins mentioned to the Mayor that she wished to become more active within the City this year, and the Mayor invited her to come to the Municipal Center on Monday evening to attend a meeting of the Public Safety and Health Committee.

Chairman Potter extended her thanks to all of the Council Members for all of the work they do and the long hours they devote to the City. She also recognized the Mayor and his staff and thanked them.

At this time Council Member Garvey complimented Chairman Potter by stating that he felt she was a very efficient Chairman, and Mrs. Potter graciously accepted the compliment.

### 14. ADJOURNMENT.

Council Member Keleti moved that the meeting be adjourned. Council Member Garvey seconded the motion, and it was unanimously adjourned at 9:12 p.m.
