CITY OF NEW CARROLLTON MINUTES COUNCIL WORKSHOP MEETING WEDNESDAY, MAY 4, 2022

The City Council Workshop Meeting was held at 7:00 p.m., on Wednesday, May 4, 2022, as a virtual meeting. Attending were Chairperson Cynthia DB Mills; Councilmembers Allyne Hooks, Katrina Dodro, and Briana Urbina; Mayor Phelecia Nembhard; City Administrative Officer Latasha Gatling; Assistant City Administrative Officer Michael McMahon; Finance Director Lorna Grant-Charles; Chief of Police David G. Rice; Information Technology Administrator Andrew Facey; and Office Manager Araceli Guzman.

1. CALL TO ORDER

Chairperson Mills welcomed everyone and called the Workshop meeting to order.

2. REPORT OF THE MAYOR AND ADMINISTRATION

Mayor Nembhard referred to Chief of Police David Rice for his report.

Chief Rice began by reporting April's crime statistics and calls for service. He then stated PD is working on the Bicycle Rodeo scheduled for May 14th.

Mayor Nembhard reported that the Youth Activities Grants have been given out to four organizations. She then reported that the Green Team Cleanup event went well picking up 36 bags of trash along Riverdale and in Frenchman's Creek Condominium. At the last food distribution event, 250 families were served. On Arbor Day we held a ceremony and planted two trees. She then stated Administration has been receiving calls about mortgage and rental assistance. We have been forwarding residents to available State programs until the ARPA funds are approved in the budget. The Mayor concluded by saying she was recently asked about where she stood on the MAGLEV project. She commented the City previously expressed opposition to that project.

3. Council Questions/Council Announcements

Councilmember Dodro asked about a grant for a skateboard park that Senator Paul Pinksy reported on in a recent newsletter. Then she asked that after the budget is approved, can the Green Team be put on a future agenda to discuss environmental issues. The Mayor commented that the City has not received any notification of a skateboard park grant.

Councilmember Urbina asked the Chief to respond to what was reported in the media this week. He stated it was a personnel matter and could not comment.

Chairperson Mills reported that Prince George's County Public Schools approached the Mayor about purchasing several parcels from the City to rebuild and expand several schools in the City. A discussion followed.

4. ARPA BUDGET

Michael McMahon was recognized by Chairperson Mills. Mr. McMahon stated that in your packets is a five-year budget plan for all \$8.1M. This budget plan will be kept separate from the regular city budget. He then went through each line item. A discussion followed.

5. ARPA GRANT MANGER POSITION

Mr. McMahon stated the Administration intended to have a job description ready for this meeting; however, we were unable to have that ready tonight.

6. Introduction of Budget Ordinance

Chairperson asked for a Councilmember to read the introduction of Ordinance 22-05 into the record.

Councilmember Dodro then stated: Ordinance 22-05, an operating and capital budget for the City of New Carrollton for the FY 2023 effective July 1, 2022, ending on June 30, 2023; Establishing the tax rate to be levied upon the taxable property within the City; Authorizing the collection of such taxes; Specifying a rate of interest to be charged upon overdue personal property taxes, liens and unpaid fees; Adopting annual budgets for the Commercial and/or Industrial Properties Special Public Safety Taxing District and the Multifamily Properties Special Public Safety Taxing District; Establishing the Annual Tax Rate to be levied upon the Special Public Safety Taxing Districts; and all things generally relating to the adoption of an annual budget for the City of New Carrollton.
